With the growth of social media and increased online presence, cyberstalking has emerged as a significant threat to digital safety and privacy.

Cyberstalking can be defined as the persistent use of the Internet, email, or other digital communication tools to harass, threaten, monitor, or intimidate an individual or group. This behavior is usually unwanted and may include repeated contact, surveillance, or spreading false information about the victim.

The main objectives of cyberstalking are to harass and intimidate individuals by causing them fear, stress, and emotional distress. Cyberstalkers often aim to control or dominate their victims by constantly monitoring their online activities or invading their privacy. In many cases, the motive is revenge or retaliation, where the stalker tries to damage the victim's reputation through defamation or spreading false information.

Some cyberstalkers also seek to gather sensitive personal or financial data for misuse, or use threats and blackmail to exploit the victim. Overall, the primary goal of cyberstalking is to disturb the victim's peace of mind and misuse digital platforms to exercise power and control..
